Course Description **MATH 307** is an introduction to the theory, methods of computation, and applications of Linear Algebra. The course is required for students who major in mathematics (except middle grades mathematics) and it counts toward the minor in mathematics.

The course covers standard material on matrices, systems of equations, n -dimensional space, linear transformations, vector spaces, inner product spaces, eigenvalues, and eigenvectors. Supplemental material and *Mathematica* applications will be included.

Learning Outcomes After successfully completing the course, students will

- * Be able to solve systems of linear equations
- * Be able to prove fundamental theorems about matrices, n -dimensional space, linear transformations, vector spaces, and inner product spaces
- * Be able to apply matrix methods to solve certain practical problems
- * Be able to analyze linear transformations and sets of vectors in R^n
- * Understand the concepts of one-to-one, onto, spanning, and linear independence
- * Be able to compute determinants, inverses, eigenvalues and eigenvectors of $n \times n$ matrices
- * Be able to use a calculator to perform matrix operations
- * Have a basic understanding of using *Mathematica* for linear algebra

Attendance Policy
