CATALOG ENTRY: Senior Standing and major in philosophy OR consent of instructor. A capstone course designed for senior philosophy majors. Students will complete projects that demonstrate their research, writing, and analytical skills. Content areas of the seminar will vary by semester and instructor.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: The course is conceived as both a summation and review of past work, and as an opportunity to focus on a new research project. The former will include (1) individual student retrospectives over their own course-work in philosophy to date, and (2) a brief look at some major philosophical terms and problems that should be part of everyone's philosophical vocabulary. For this second segment of the course, we will use: Barry Loewer, ed., 30-Second Philosophies: The 50 most thought-provoking philosophies, each explained in half a minute (2009). Our third focus (3) will be a special theme involving a collective reading of select texts and individual research essays. (It will also be possible for students to pursue individual research projects of their own choosing, should they wish to do so.)
