Course Description: "Trigonometry" means the study of "tri-gons", or triangles. Trigonometry is used to determine lengths and distances based upon angles, or vice versa. Students in Math 117 will be able to apply knowledge of the unit circle; trigonometric functions and graphs; trigonometric identities and equations; right triangle trigonometry; laws of sines and cosines; DeMoivre's Theorem; vectors and applications of trigonometry. Further, students will learn to model and solve problems appropriate for the field of study in majors of the sciences.

Learning Objectives: This course fulfills the Quantitative Reasoning requirement in the Foundations category of WKU's Colonnade program. Quantitative Reasoning courses teach students to interpret, illustrate, and communicate mathematical and/or statistical ideas. Students will learn to model and solve problems. As part of that program, Math 117 has the following learning objectives:

Students will demonstrate the ability to:

- 1. Interpret information presented in mathematical and/or statistical forms.
- 2. Illustrate and communicate mathematical and/or statistical information symbolically, visually and/or numerically.
- 3. Determine when computations are needed and execute the appropriate computations.
- 4. Apply an appropriate model to the problem to be solved.
- 5. Make inferences, evaluate assumptions, and assess limitations in estimation modeling and/or statistical analysis.

Prerequisites: 4 years of high school mathematics including Algebra I and II and geometry, and one of the following:

- (i) Math 116 with a grade of C or better
- (ii) Math ACT of 27 or better
- (iii) (Math ACT \ge 22 or Math SAT \ge 510) and (WKU Math Placement Test or KYOTE College Algebra Test score \ge 18).

Course Materials: This course participates in the Big Red Backpack program. This program is designed to provide immediate access to required materials for all students at prices cheaper than any other option.

The MyLabMath online course software and eBook will be delivered to you automatically (through Blackboard) by enrolling in this course unless you choose to opt-out. If you opt out, you will have to purchase the MyLabMath access directly from the publisher, and it will be more expensive. By participating in this program, The WKU Store will bill your Student Billing account, and you will see a charge appear under this Term along with Tuition and Fees ("Account Summary by Term" under the Student Services tab) labelled as "The WKU Store Purchases" after the Add/Drop period.

To access the online text and homework assignments, log onto Blackboard, select Math 117-012, and from the content menu, select MyMathLab.

Math Tutoring Lab: The Math Lab in COHH 2124 is open to assist you with any math problems you have. The Lab is open (tentatively) 8:30 – 4:30 Monday through Thursday and 8:30 – 2 Friday.

Attendance Policy: Registration in a course obligates the student to be regular and punctual in class attendance. Three or more unexcused absences from class may result in an "F" as final course grade. A student absent from class bears full responsibility for subject matter and announcements missed.

Testing and Grading: Students are responsible for material presented in class and the material in the text. There will be three one-hour in-class tests, each worth 100 points. The comprehensive final exam, to be given 10:30-12:30 Wednesday, December 4, 2024, is worth 150 points. MyMathLab homework will count for 80 points. There may between 0 and 40 more points of daily grades, consisting of announced or unannounced quizzes, written homework, or projects. Grading will follow the 10-point scale. An unofficial list of your grades will be available to you on Blackboard. For any graded work not taken in a proctored environment, during the grading process the instructor may require you to satisfactorily explain your solutions by video-chat to receive credit.
